DON G. WILCOX (1936-2024)



Don Wilcox's extraordinary career led him to be regarded as one of the finest band directors and music educators in the nation. He was born and raised in Oklahoma and received his degrees from the University of Michigan and California State University - Long Beach. Following successful teaching positions in California, he came to West Virginia University in 1971, where he would stay for 34 years until his retirement in 2005. Within a decade, he grew the WVU Marching band from 88 members to almost 300. This rapid expansion was due to his extraordinary vision that included allowing women to enroll, allowing student leaders to assist in the philosophical planning and teaching, and adding memorable music and drill to the bands' pregame show –

which soon became his signature legacy.

During Wilcox's time as marching band director, the band continued to grow in size and quality gaining a national reputation. This progress culminated in 1997, when the "The Pride of West Virginia" was named a recipient of the prestigious Sudler Trophy as the nation's premiere university marching band.

Wilcox's work with the Wind Symphony was also significant. His love of classic literature, traditional and circus marches, and cutting-edge repertoire helped lead to quality performances that received both regional and national recognition. Notable Wind Symphony performances included two at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and one at an international conference in Manchester, England. He also led the WVU Alumni Band on seven international tours entertaining audiences throughout Europe.

Wilcox is a Past-President of the American Bandmasters Association and has received numerous honors including: WVU's Outstanding Teacher Award, the 1993 Golden Apple Outstanding Faculty Award, the Sudler Order of Merit from the John Philip Sousa Foundation, the Distinguished Service To Music Medal from the National Council of Kappa Kappa Psi, and special citations from four Governors for his contributions to the state of West Virginia. In 2009 he was inducted into WVU's Order of Vandalia, the University's highest honor. Recently, he was elected into the Hall of Fame of the National Band Association.

Wilcox career led him to conducting bands from one-room schools in rural Appalachia to several of the major concert halls in the world, as well as in all 50 states and almost 30 foreign countries. He served several times as a conductor at the prestigious Musashino Academia Musicae in Tokyo. Upon retirement, Professor Emeritus Don Wilcox and his wife Kaye Jean moved to Northport, Michigan, where he conducted the Northport Community Band, as well as maintained an active schedule as a clinician, conductor, and adjudicator.
